Games sponsorship:

Currently, three games are supported by a generous anonymous Old Paulian donor (Class of '85). The donor had pledged RM 1million sponsorship for this development programme. This programme is managed by the OPA Management Committee and organised it with the co-operation of the two schools. The Sports Development programme focuses on the development of 3 games - Hockey, Badminton and Basketball for both the Primary and Secondary schools. The key contribution of the programme is the financial support it provides to secure the services of qualified coaches and provide funding for the purchase of core training needs like shuttlecocks.

The programme enables us to provide the schools with hockey coaches (Mr R. Subramaniam, Mr Lawrence Tan Kim San & Mr Tan Ghee Wah for SPI Secondary & Mr Bubir Singh, Mohd Khusain Bin Ibrahim & Mohd Tarimidi Bin Meh for SPI Primary), two badminton elite squad coaches (Mr Loh Yah Shang & Mr Lee Nam Yew) and three other badminton coaches (Mr Francis Siow, Mr Gregory Siow & Mr Leslie Lee) teaching the basic skills of badminton and a basketball coach (Mr Gan Chin Yao) for each of the schools. Teachers play a very big and important role in the success of each of these programmes and without their enthusiasm and spirit, it would not be mission impossible.

Under this programme, the school players participated in several local competitions. They had shown vast improvement in all these games.

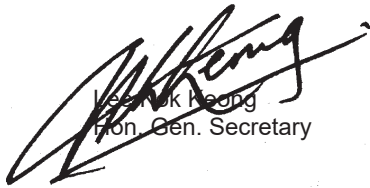
